Houston Qualifier Sends One To Nationals

The USBA National Qualifying Tournament held at Goodays Billiards In Houston Texas on April 9 ended in dramatic fashion, with **Ahmet Ozan (right)** defeating Jorge Gonzalez 25-24 to win entry into the USBA 3-Cushion National Champioship. Turkish player Ahmet Ozan may be new to the Houston area but he's certainly not not new to billiards. He has been playing at Goodays Billiards on Bellaire Blvd. for some time now and is known by many as a fierce competitor with a great depth of knowledge. He recently joined the USBA with the purpose of playing in the upcoming National Championship In June in Tucson, Arizona. Here is how he reached his goal.

On Sunday Ahmet's skills were on full display as he went undefeated in the qualifier event, capping his victory in the final match against Jorge Gonzalez who placed second. In that decisive game, in a race to 25, Ahmet jumped out ahead quickly with a run of 7 in the third inning. Jorge battled back and eventually took the lead. Then it was Ahmet's



turn to fight back! Although trailing, but stayed in the hunt, until finally catching Jorge who had first reached 24. With both players tied and on the hill, in the tense closing moments, it was Ahmet who prevailed 25-24 to claim the victory. His high run of 7 was best in the event.

If Ahmet can sharpen his game even more he may be ready to surprise the field when he plays in his first USBA National Championship at the Casino Del Sol Resort. Congratulations and best of luck to Ahmet Ozan, our Houston National Qualifier.

any players would see the gigantic red ball in the corner and a sort of brain freeze occurs. Analysis stops, and they enter "Gotta go for it!" mode. Yes, you can draw the cue ball off the left side of the white to the top long rail, but it's not the best option. Playing this shot with lots of draw, or as a spin shot, can be difficult to control.

Looking at the red ball now, many players might also dislike the thin hit required off the left side, when there is a natural fuller hit 3-rail shot off the right side. The harder thin hit off the left side turns out to be a better choice though. Why?

Because the yellow is a big ball. Play the shot as a 5-rail shot and you have two chances to score. This also allows you to hit the ball slightly fuller, which helps with your accuracy. Another advantage is that by playing this shot with make speed you'll have all three balls close to the center of the table, with a good likelihood of a short angle follow-up.

The key lesson here is that big balls aren't always in corners. Whenever you're playing a shot towards a ball near the center of the table, always check to see what will happen if you miss the shot long or short. Often you'll find that missing it on a certain side gives you a two-way shot, and then you can greatly increase your chance

of scoring by favoring the shot towards that side, and using enough speed to make it both ways. In fact, whenever you have an equal chance to play a shot either 3-rails or 5-rails, the 5-rail path is generally more predictable and easier, as the extra cushions are frequently "self-correcting" if you're a little long or short.

Parker Hess Memorial Attracts Full Field of 24

The fourth annual Parker Hess Memorial 3-Cushion Billiard Tournament was held at the Ashland, Oregon Elks Lodge on May 5 - 7, 2017. Aided by a donation of \$1,000.00 to the prize fund from Bob Tracy and a 50% match from the USBA, we were able to attract a full field of 24 players for the first time in several years.

Players, who came from as far as Edmonds, Washington and San Diego, California and everywhere in between, were divided into three eight-person round-robin flights of mixed abilities. Each flight consisted of 4 B/B+ players, 2 C+ players, and 2 C players. Three separate single elimination finals were held for B/B+, C+, and C players. The top two B/B+ finishers from each flight were seeded into a 6-player B final. For both the C+ players and the C players, the one top finisher in each flight qualified for a three-person single elimination final.

Three of the B players finished with perfect records of 7-0 and 175 total points, and all were from different flights, so there could be no head to head consideration. Consequently, these players were seeded according to Points Against. Robert Spicknall from Seattle and Dustin Tran, a young player new to our tournament from Vancouver, WA were seeded 1 and 2 respectively and received byes into the second finals round. In the first finals round, Ramses Verlinden of Portland, OR defeated Ertan Tarhan from Seattle with an excellent game of 25 points in 21 innings. In the other first finals round match, Vinh Truong of Portland defeated Raye Raskin from the San Francisco Bay Area. In the next round, there was a very tight game in which Vinh Truong narrowly beat Dustin Tran 25-24. Robert Spicknall went on to win first place over Vinh Truong, and Dustin Tran beat Ramses Verlinden for third place with an excellent 18 inning game. Dustin also won the High Run prize

for the B prelims with a run of 7.

In the C+ Final, Rudy Vigil of Medford, OR was top seed with a bye into the final match. He defeated JR Greenlee, also of Medford, who got to the final match by defeating John Fleming of Portland. Rudy also won the C+ High Run prize in the prelims with a run of 5.
